Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-13(9)(b) by Not Ensuring That Hazardous Chemicals Were Inaccessible to Children. In the 3 and Older Classroom, There Was a Container of Bleach Wipes on the Side of the Sink, Accessible to Children, and Another Container of Bleach Wipes on the Ki (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-24(13)(a)(b) by Not Ensuring That Breast Milk Brought From Home for an Individual Child's Use Was Labeled with the Child's Name and Time That It Had Been Prepared or Arrived at the Facility. In the Infant Room Refrigerator, There Were Two Bottles (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-14(6) by Not Conducting a Disaster Drill at Least Once Every Six Months. At the Time of the Inspection, the Provider Had Not Conducted Disaster Drill at Least Once Every Six Months. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
