In Room Two A, There Were 12 Older Toddlers and One 2 Year Old with Two Caregivers. The Maximum S (2), The Licensee Was Out of Compliance with This Rule R381-100-6(12)(a)-(b) by Not Having Complete Children's Records. In the Facility, the Admission and Health Assessment Forms for Two Children Had Not Been Reviewed, Updated, and Signed Annually by a Parent or Guardian. (1), and The Licensee Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Providing and Maintaining Active Supervision of Each Child. In Room 6, the Caregiver Stated She Had 14 Children in Her Group.
