Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-13(11)(b) by Not Ensuring That Electrical Outlets Without a Protective Cap or Safety Device Were Inaccessible to Children Younger Than Five Years Old. In the Preschool Room, There Was an Electrical Outlet Without a Protective Cap or Safety Devic (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-23(8) by Not Ensuring That the Caregivers Sanitized the Diapering Surface After Each Diaper Change. In the Children's Bathroom, the Caregiver Did Not Sanitize the Diapering Surface After the Diaper Change. (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-7(7)(c) by Not Ensuring That the Director Designee Had a Current First aid/CPR Certification. At the Time of the Inspection, the Acting Director Designee Did Not Have a Current First aid/CPR Certification. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance As (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
