Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-13(17) by Not Ensuring That Hot Water Accessible to Children Did Not Exceed 120 Degrees Fahrenheit. In the Children's Bathrooms and in the Infant Room, the Hot Water Temperature Exceeded 120 Degrees Fahrenheit. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring That Caregivers Who Were 17 Years Old Only Had Unsupervised Contact with Any Child in Care, Including During Offsite Activities, When There Was a Director or Director Designee Physically Present and Available as Needed. At the Time O (2), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring That Protective Cushioning Covered the Entire Surface of Each Required Use Zone. On the 2 and Older Playground, There Were Two Pieces of Play Equipment That Did Not Have the Required Protective Cushioning in Their Use Zones. This Was (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
