Across 4 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-6(8) by Not Ensuring That OL Was Informed of Any Changes to the Program's Telephone Number Within 48 Hours of the Change. At the Time of the Inspection, the Provider Still Had Not Informed OL of a New Telephone Number Since the Listed Contact Ph (2), The Licensee Was Out of Compliance with R381-100-10(a) by Failing to Ensure Infants Are Only Mixed with Toddlers, Unless the Mixed Age Group of Children Has Eight or Fewer Children in It. During an Inspection, the Licensor Observed an Infant and a Toddler, on the Playground, with a Mixed Age Group O (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-20(2)(e) by Not Ensuring That Each Vehicle Used for Transporting Children Contained First Aid Supplies, Including at Least Antiseptic, Bandages, and Tweezers. At the Facility, the Van Used for Transporting Children Did Not Have Tweezers and Banda (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
