Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-10(3)(a) by Not Ensuring That if Infants or Toddlers Were Mixed with Older Children, the Group Had Eight or Fewer Children. In the toddler/2's Room, There Was a Mixed Age Group of Children Which Included Younger Toddlers, Older Toddlers and Two Y (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring That Caregivers Provided and Maintained Active Supervision of Each Child, Including the Caregivers Knowing the Number of Children in Their Care at Any Time. In the Toddler Room, the Caregiver Did Not Know the Number of Children in The (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring That Each Child's Admission and Health Assessment Form Was Reviewed, Updated, and Signed or Initialed by the Parent at Least Annually. At the Time of the Inspection, the Admission and Health Assessment Form for One Child Had Not Been (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
