Across 2 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-13(18) by Not Ensuring That High Chairs That Are Used by Children Had Safety Straps or Safety Devices. In the Infant and Toddler Outdoor Area, There Was a High Chair That Did Not Have Safety Straps Attached to It. (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-20(2)(c) by Not Ensuring That the Vehicle Used for Transporting Children Has a Current Vehicle Registration. At the Time of the Inspection, One of the Vehicles Did Not Have a Current Vehicle Registration. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance. (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Having an Inappropriate Interaction Between a Staff Member and a Child in Care. In the Facility, a Staff Member's Interaction with a Child in Care Resulted in Physical Pain or Discomfort to the Child From Being Hit by the Staff Member. (1). None of the 4 findings were critical.

- **The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-20(2)(c) by Not Ensuring That the Vehicle Used for Transporting Children Has a Current Vehicle Registration. At the Time of the Inspection, One of the Vehicles Did Not Have a Current Vehicle Registration. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance.**
