Across 2 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-40-13(9)(a) by Not Ensuring That Hazardous or Corrosive Materials Were Inaccessible to Children. In the Open Hallway Near the Children's Bathroom, There Were Batteries in an Open Package, Wood Glue, and Super Glue in a Drawer, Accessible to Children.
