Across 4 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-11(1)(e) by Not Ensuring That Each Caregiver Maintains Active Supervision of Each Child by Knowing the Number of Children in Their Care at Any Time. In the Teddy Bears Room, the Caregiver Stated They Had 6 Children in Care When There Were 7 Child (1), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with R381-100-16(3)(b) by Failing to Ensure Children Are Not Served a Food or Drink They Are Allergic or Sensitive To. During the Inspection, the Licensor Discovered a Child Was Given a Snack Item Which Contained a Food Product They Were Allergic to Resulting in T (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Having a Caregiver Who Had an Inappropriate Interaction with a Child in Care. In the Facility, a Caregiver Was Observed Having an Interaction with a Child Which Caused Physical Pain or Discomfort to the Child. (1). None of the 4 findings were critical.
