Across 2 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-11(1)(a)-(g) by Not Ensuring That Caregivers Provided and Maintained Active Supervision of Each Child, Including Knowing the Number of Children in Their Care at Any Time. In the Preschool Room, the Caregivers Did Not Know the Number of Children I (2) and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-13(4) by Not Ensuring That Choking Hazards Were Inaccessible to Children Younger Than Three Years Old. In the 2's Room, There Were Broken Crayons, Which Were a Choking Hazard, in a Sensory Table, Accessible to Children Younger Than Three Years Old (1). None of the 3 findings were critical.
