Across 1 inspection since 2025, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-23(9) by Not Ensuring Caregivers Wash Their Hands After Completing a Diaper Change. During the Diapering Observation, the Caregiver Did Not Wash Their Hands After Completing a Diaper Change. (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-19(2) by Not Ensuring That the Highest Designated Play Surface on Stationary Equipment Used by Infants and Toddlers Does Not Exceed Three Feet in Height. In the Outdoor Play Area, Toddlers Were Playing on Play Equipment That Exceeded Three Feet I (2), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-7(9)(c) by Not Ensuring That Caregivers Complete the Preservice Training Offered by the Department Before Caring for Children. During the Inspection, There Was a Caregiver Who Had Not Completed Preservice Training and Was Caring for Children. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
