Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring Electrical Outlets Had Protective Covers When Not in Use for Children Younger Than 5 Years Old. In the Living Room, There Were Two Outlets Without a Protective Cover. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance. (4) and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring That Admission and Health Assessment Form Is Reviewed, Updated, and Signed or Initialed by the Parent at Least Annually. At the Time of Inspection, Paperwork for One Child in Care Did Not Have an Annual Update and Signature. This Was (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
