Across 3 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-8(2)(d) by Allowing Individuals to Be Involved with Child Care in the Program Before Receiving Notification of Eligibility From Office of Licensing. In the Facility, One Individual Was Counting in Caregiver-to-child Ratios Before Getting Notifica (1), The Licensee Was Out of Compliance with R381-100-12(5)(a)-(f) by Failing to Ensure That Interactions with Children Do Not Include Any Action That Produces Physical Pain or Discomfort. During the Inspection, the Licensors Determined That a Child Had Gloves Taped to Their Hands to Prevent Them From Con (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-7(9)(c) by Not Ensuring That Caregivers Complete the Preservice Training Offered by the Department Before Caring for Children. At the Time of the Inspection, There Were Two Caregivers Who Had Not Completed Preservice Training and Had Been Caring (1). None of the 3 findings were critical.
