Across 4 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring That Hazardous Chemicals Were Inaccessible to Children. In the First Floor Hallway, Where the Children Pass Through to Use the Bathrooms, There Was a Bottle of Fish Tank Conditioner on an Open Shelf Near the Floor, Accessible to Child (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Ensuring That Caregivers Completed the 2-1/2 Hours of Preservice Training Offered by the Department Before Caring for Children. At the Time of the Inspection, There Was a Caregiver Who Had Been Caring for Children Who Did Not Complete the 2-1/ (2), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-10(2)(a)-(b) by Not Ensuring That for Any Mixed Age Group of Children, They Maintained at Least the Number of Required Caregivers and Did Not Exceed the Number of Children in the Caregiver-to-child Ratio.
