● **Staff Record - Days & Hours Worked**

Staff are not accurately documenting hours worked when used to meet staff-to-child ratios. On the day of the licensing v

● **Assistant Child Care Teacher - Supervision**

251.05(3)(g)1.

Assistant teachers were working alone and were not under the supervision of a child care teacher on 4/6/26, 4/22/26, 5/4

● **Staff Orientation - Develop, Implement, Document**

251.05(4)(a)

Staff A does not have documentation of a written orientation (staff orientation checklist) on file.

● **Supervision Of Children**

251.055(1)(a)

On the day of the licensing visit, a child was left alone in the toddler room, when the other children and teacher left

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● **Supervision - Teacher Per Group Of Children**

251.055(1)(b)

On the day of the licensing visit, a group of four (4) infants were not supervised by a qualified teacher. Based on a re

● **Mixed-Age Group - Staff-To-Child Ratio**

251.055(2)(c)

On 5/11/26, staff-to-child ratios were not met when 7 children, ranging in age from 1-3 years, were in care with 1 staff

● **Mixed Age Group With Children Under Age 2 - Group Size**

Group size was exceeded in the toddler room on 4/27/26 when there were 11 children, including children under 18 months o

● **Staff-To-Child Ratios - Non-Classroom Duties**

Staff was not free from non-classroom duties when on the day of the licensing visit, staff was observed leaving the clas

● **Meals & Snacks - Intervals**

On the day of the licensing visit, staff reported breakfast was served at 8:00am and licensing specialist observed lunch

● **Child Record - Health History**

The health history for Child 1, who has identified as having multiple food allergies, is incomplete; there is no documen

● **Supervision - Opening & Closing Hours**

On the day of the licensing visit, an assistant teacher (staff A) who has not completed the qualifying course was provid

● **Outdoor Play Space - Enclosure**

251.06(11)(b)7.

In the outdoor play space, there are several areas on the bottom of the fence that have gaps greater than 4 inches.

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● **Sharing Information About Food & Other Allergies**

A child with a peanut and egg allergy was not listed on the kitchen allergy list. **This was corrected during the licens

● **Medical Log - Observation Or Evidence Of Injury**

● **Medication - Storage**

Children s Tylenol, observed on the premise for an enrolled child, is expired; the Tylenol expired December 2025.

● **Food Storage - Refrigeration Units**

251.06(9)(d)1.b.

The kitchen freezer had a reading of 6 degrees. Frozen foods must be maintained at 0 degrees or below.

● **Medical Log - Pages & Entries**

251.07(6)(dm)2.

In the infant room, lines were skipped in the medical log book. **This was corrected during the monitoring visit**

● **Continuation License - Application Materials Submission**

● **Meal Prep Personnel - Training**

251.05(3)(gr)3.a.

Staff B and C, identified as the meal prep personnel, does not have documentation in completing at least 4 hours of trai

● **Garbage Containers - Construction & Disposal Schedule**

251.06(2)(n)

The garbage can in the kitchen did not have a lit on it. Food residue was observed in the garbage can.

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● **Radon - Testing, Current Providers**

251.06(2)(p)1.b.

A test for radon gas levels was not conducted by 9/1/23.

● **Emergencies - Practice Written Plans**

251.06(3)(b)2.

There is no documentation that monthly fire evacuation drills were conducted for the month of February 2025.

● **Food Storage - Safety**

251.06(9)(d)1.

Several containers of food, including applesauce and beans, were observed spoiled in the kitchen refrigerator.

● **Food Storage - Perishable, Potentially Hazardous Food**

251.06(9)(d)1.a.

A carton of milk was observed sitting on the kitchen counter. **The milk was thrown out during the monitoring visit**

● **Food Storage - Refrigeration Units**

251.06(9)(d)1.b.

The thermometer in the kitchen freezer had a reading of 2 degrees. Frozen foods must be maintained at 0 degrees or below

● **Food Storage - Covering Refrigerated Food**

251.06(9)(d)1.d.

An open container of egg patties and an open bag of waffles and hamburger patties were observed in the kitchen freezer.

● **Food - Leftover Prepared Food**

251.06(9)(f)3.

There is leftover food stored in the refrigerator dated 11/12/24 that was not used within 36 hours or frozen immediately

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
